## Battle Cry

Wow, it hardly seems possible that after so much time and effort the Battle Cry event is history – at least for this year. Thank you for all the help that so many of you gave.

I didn't know what to expect going to this event. I have never been involved with Acquire the Fire before, and had no point of reference other than the material they sent me. The youth, though, were excited about Battle Cry, looking forward to the kind of experience that they have had with ATF in the past.

Our trip to San Francisco was pretty uneventful, though the rain cut down our ability to see drastically, which poses a problem when you are driving a fifteen-passenger van in traffic.

We arrived in San Francisco about half an hour after we had planned. After checking into the hotel, we decided to use the public transportation system [MUNI] instead of our vans. So picture a herd of kids with leaders shepherding them into the public transportation system that none of them have used before. It was fun but chaotic. By the time we got enough change out of the machines to buy enough tickets for our crew, we were half an hour late. We arrived at AT&T Park as the first worship segment was winding up.

As we arrived at the stadium it began to rain again, lightly at first, but then harder. We found ourselves pouring the water off of our chairs and huddling under umbrellas and poncho style rain jackets that worked – kind of. More than half of us were soaked to the skin, but no one suggested leaving. We joined the multitude there in worship and in listening to the teaching of Ron Luce and others.

In brief, the message of the first night was this: we need to follow our Lord, seeking to honor him despite the cost in a world that will do all it can to destroy us spiritually. The message of salvation is not one of fire insurance, or of a "blessed" life free from pain and struggle, but a call to accept the amazing gift of salvation that God has provided through the sacrifice of His Son, Jesus Christ, in our place. We were reminded of Matthew 10:34-39 where Jesus told his disciples that their relationship with Him would bring division, and that anyone who did not take up his cross and follow Him was not worthy of Him.

The next day we intended to use the MUNI again, but the system was temporarily shut down because of a demonstration, so we walked a dozen blocks through downtown San Francisco to the ball-park. Thankfully, the weather was much better with a mix of brief overcast and mostly sunshine in the area around the stadium and heavy clouds all around, as if God's people in the stadium

were deliberately shielded from the weather. Maybe we were. I don't believe in coincidence.

Throughout the day we heard message after message (between concerts and worship music), covering a variety of topics, but primarily emphasizing

the fact that we have to be careful who we allow to "brand" us, not getting sucked into focusing on, and worshiping, the things of the world, but worshiping God, and removing the things in our lives that hinder us. We were encouraged to stay pure, and not listen to the lies the world throws at us about sex. We heard testimonies to what God has done in the lives of people from some very rough backgrounds. We were told that we must fight to take back our schools, our communities, and our country, with each of us knowing our plan of attack and working together. The final unveiling [which most of us missed] was of the "Teenage Bill of Rights" (see the back page), which places the responsibility on all to stand up in our communities and fight for what we know is right.

To sum up the message of the whole event: the world, the flesh, and the Devil are constantly bombarding us with their garbage, and we have brought the enemy into our very homes, allowing him to baby-sit our children, and to feed us a constant line of propaganda. We, the Christians of this nation have sat idly by, allowing "the terrorists of virtue" to sell their lies unopposed. If we do not stand up and fight back we will lose this generation. We have to work together, helping our brothers and sisters in Christ to be strong, and reaching out, with them, to the lost and hurting world around us. We have to make the world understand that we will not stand for, emulate, watch, or pay for their garbage. We have to take responsibility. We have to fight. No, it will not be easy, but if we do not act the devil will win by default and we will end up in a nation every bit as godless as Western Europe has become. You have heard the call to battle. Lead, follow, or get out of the way.

## Sonshine Secret Sisters

The month of April is to remember Easter so how about this Idea! This is a unique gift that I saw on television several weeks ago, and thought you might enjoy it too.

Simply place individual portions of this cake mix and glaze into plastic bags and dress them up in special microwave-safe 1½-cup mugs, along with the directions for making “personal” Fudgy “CUP” Cakes. You will surely be remembered for this.

### CAKE MIX:

1 package (18.25 oz.) chocolate cake mix (your favorite brand)  
1 package (4 serving size) instant chocolate pudding mix

### GLAZE MIX:

2 2/3 cups confectioners’ sugar  
¼ cup powdered dry cocoa mix

1. In a large bowl, combine the dry cake and pudding mixes, blend well with a whisk.
2. In a medium bowl, combine the confectioners’ sugar and cocoa mix
3. Divide the cake mix evenly into 8 small plastic bags about ½ cup each. Seal and label.
4. Make individual microwave Fudgy “CUP” cakes (below) or pack the mixes to give as gifts (below).

Make a fudgy “CUP” Cake: Spray the inside of a microwave-safe mug, generously, with nonstick cooking spray. Pour prepared bag of cake mix into the mug. Add 1 egg, 1 tablespoon of vegetable oil, and 1 tablespoon water. Mix until all ingredients are combined. Microwave at 100% power for 2 minutes. Meanwhile, place prepared bag of glaze mix in a small bowl and add 1½ teaspoons milk; mix well then pour glaze over the mug cake immediately after removing it from the microwave. Serve cake warm in the mug.

Giving Fudgy “CUP” Cake Mix as a Gift: Place 1 sealed cake mix bag and 1 sealed glaze mix bag into a microwave-safe mug and attach the recipe for Fudgy “CUP” Cake (above).
